## • Volunteer Hours – Larry Zauberis, CO

- The total value of the volunteer effort reported in 2014 was \$14,419,615.89.
  - An increase of \$466,666.18 over the 2013 value of \$13,972,949.71.
    (~0.3%).
- 417134 hours of basic and skilled work, administrative service, education and public meeting participation valued at \$10,180,960.
  - An increase of 49,973 hours (\$1,375,433)
- 1726179 miles were recorded for personal vehicles and stock hauling valued at \$1,684,563.
  - An increase of 88,127 miles (\$77,021).
- 7152 hours of equipment use were recorded valued at \$300,519.
  - A decrease of 4409 hours (\$114,511).
- 13,044 head of pack and saddle stock were used for 21,832 stock days with a value of \$2,182,300.
  - A significant decrease from 30732 stock days (\$890,900).
- Cash and in-kind donations were down an insignificant \$377.

Resolution to Oppose the Transfer or Sales of Federal Public Lands Managed by the United States Departments of Interior and Agriculture – <u>Approved 4/25/15</u>



#### RESOLUTION TO OPPOSE THE TRANSFER OR SALE OF FEDERAL PUBLIC LANDS MANAGED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENTS OF INTERIOR AND AGRICULTURE

WHEREAS, the mission of the Back Country Horsemen of America is to work to ensure public lands remain open to recreational equestrian saddle and pack stock use, and

WHEREAS, the public lands of this nation managed by the United States Departments of Interior and Agriculture are a part of our national treasure and heritage, and

WHEREAS, these public lands are held in perpetuity to benefit future generations of Americans because of the renewable resources and recreational value, and

WHEREAS, we support the sustainable management of resources on federal lands in cooperation with other stakeholders, and

WHEREAS, the transfer or sale of these lands will remove large acreages from the nations federal public lands system, fragment existing land areas, compromise public access, and set a precedent for the privatization of all public land, and

WHEREAS, specifically the disposal of these federal public lands will decrease the opportunity for all recreational use of these lands,

WHEREAS, no federal lands should be removed or transferred except for lands considered under the Federal Land Transaction Reconciliation Act (FLTRA, PL 106-248),

**THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Back Country Horsemen of America to go on record in opposition of any plan, action or legislation for the disposal, sale, or transfer of public lands managed by the United States Departments of Interior and Agriculture (except under FLTRA), and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this resolution be made known to the President of the United States, congressional delegations and elected officials from each state, and agency officials of the Departments of the Interior and Agriculture.

Approved by the National Board of Directors of Back Country Horsemen of America on Saturday April 25, 2015.



Back Country Horsemen of America and Bob Marshall Wilderness Outfitters are pleased to announce the first BCHA Young Persons Equine Packing Scholarship. The winner will spend 5 days and 4 nights in the Bob Marshall Wilderness in Montana learning traditional equine packing skills, Leave No Trace camping principles and exploring the ecology, history and majestic landscapes of the "Bob."

Applicants must be between 18 and 26 years of age, have basic horseback riding skills and write an essay of 100 words or less about why they want to learn to pack and how they plan to apply their knowledge once the course is over. The dates of the class are from June 23 through June 27, 2015.

The BCHA Education Foundation will pay travel expenses for round-trip airfare to Missoula, MT and 1 night lodging, before and after, the trip. The outfitters will supply ground transportation to and from Missoula and the trailhead.

The deadline for entries is Monday, May 18, 2015. The winner will be announced on June 1, 2015.
