

# Forest Service Chain Saw and Crosscut Saw Program

The National Chain Saw and Crosscut Saw program was developed to provide all sawyers (employee & volunteers) a solid foundation for safe and efficient saw operation while bucking, brushing and limbing on public lands. The course will provide the skills to safely use a saw while working on trails and serve as a refresher class for persons who have previously been certified. Safety is the most critical concern. Your safety, the safety of your coworkers and the safety of the public, should be part of every cut plan and every action you take.

This course is designed to train apprentice (A) and intermediate (B) sawyers to perform project work safely and efficiently.
