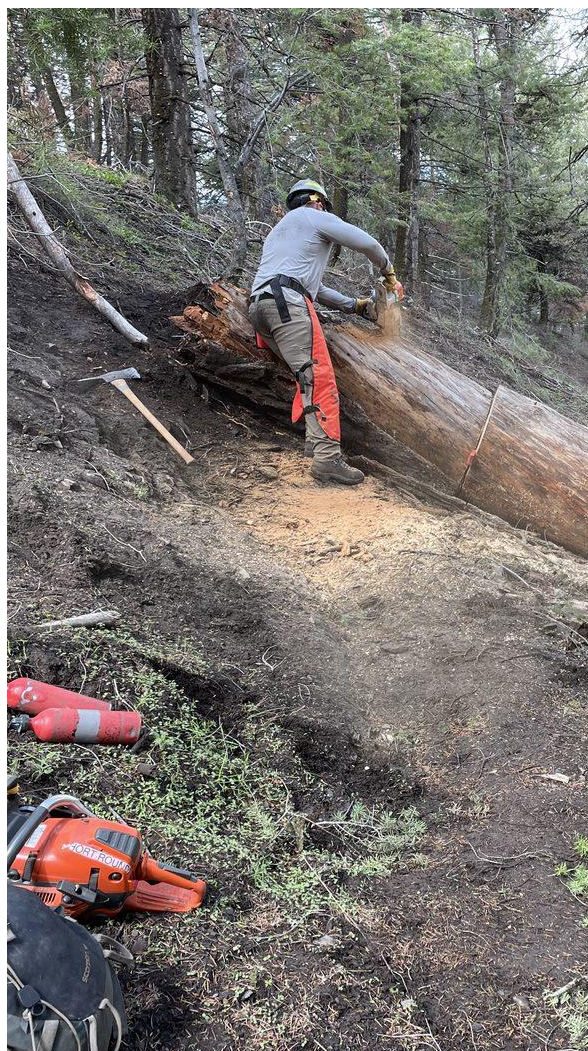
Field Update: KRD Trail Openings
